Youth Advisory Council

At the Youth Advisory Council meeting on Monday, Becky Taylor, Senior Transportation Planner from Lane County and Sherrie Bandy from Lane Education Service District, attended and presented information about National Teen Driver Safety Week, October 21-27. YAC members expressed interest in helping promote Teen Driver Safety Week.

They also presented information about Teens Driving Safely Lane County, a countywide initiative to increase driving training access for rural Lane County youth. Teens Driving Safely Lane County's primary purpose is to increase access for rural Lane County high school students. The initiative is seeking donations to help provide scholarships to teens taking driver education courses. They are also promoting the Driver Ed instructor courses in Lane County to increase the number of instructors for the classes especially in the rural communities. Fats, Oils and Grease Training

Thursday staff members from the Public Works & Development Department attended a Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) training at the Florence Events Center. The FOG training program was eight hours and focused on helping municipalities establish a FOG program. FOG is very difficult and expensive for Cottage Grove's Wastewater Treatment Plant to treat and can plug up the sewer collection lines. Establishing a FOG program to educate businesses and homeowners on the importance of not putting fats, oils, and grease into the sewer system can save the City money and extend the life of sewer piping and equipment. The program works with businesses to make sure their grease traps are operational and well maintained. Violators could receive fines as it is against Cottage Grove Municipal Code to allow fats, oils and grease to enter the City's sewer system.

Safe Routes to School - Right-of-way Acquisition & Project Overview Open House

The City is holding an Open House on October 8th from 4:00 to 6:00 pm at City Hall in the Council Chambers. Staff from the Engineering and Planning Departments will be on hand to talk about the right-of-way purchase process and why the City may need to purchase additional right-of-way from property owners within the project area.
