## **Candidate Forums**

On Monday, October 1<sup>st</sup> from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm, the League of Women Voters of Lane County will be hosting a candidate forum for the House District 7 race in the City Hall Council Chambers. Candidates Representative Cedric Hayden and Christy Inskip will be attending.

On Tuesday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 pm, the Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a candidate forum for the City Council, Wards 3 and At Large candidates. The forum will be at City Hall in the Council Chambers. Candidates for Ward 3 are Garland Burback, Raymond Ackerman, Jill Hermansen and Candace Lamb-Solesbee. Candidates for the At Large position are Mike Fleck and Ashley Rigel.

On Tuesday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 pm, the Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a candidate forum for the Lane County Commissioner candidates at City Hall in the Council Chambers. Candidates are Gary Williams and Heather Buch.

## **City Managers Around the World**

The City Manager attended the annual International City/County Management Association Annual Conference in Baltimore this week. The conference brought together over 3,400 local government managers from the United States, Canada and 24 other countries to discuss issues facing local communities and share ideas to improve services to members of their communities. The conference brings internationally recognized speakers and experts for training. This year conference attendees heard from experts like Daniel Pink, Doris Kearns Goodwin, Melissa Agnes, Greg Bell and Wes Moore.

## **Scenic Bikeway Meeting**

The City Manager attended a meeting of the Oregon Scenic Bikeway Advisory Committee last week. The committee received a brief report regarding the recruitment of a new Scenic Bikeway Coordinator to replace Alex Phillips who moved. The Oregon Scenic Bikeway will also be celebrating the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the program in 2019. The committee discussed ideas and made plans for events to celebrate the creation of the program that remains the most successful bikeway program in the country.

#### **League of Oregon Conference**

This weekend the League of Oregon Cities will be holding their Annual Conference in Eugene. Mayor Gowing and Councilors Boone, Fleck, Roberts, Ehler and Ervin and the City Manager and Community Coordinator are attending sessions at the conference covering topics such as urban renewal, housing, homelessness, the 2020 Census, school safety, data, technology, recycling and a wealth of other topics. The conference provides an opportunity for local government leaders in Oregon to gather and visit with each other about issues they are facing. Councilor Jake Boone will be a speaker at the conference, as LOC Treasurer will present the annual financial report of the League of Oregon Cities and is also on the ballot to be Vice President during the annual business meeting.

#### **Defensive Driving Training**

This week City staff attended the ODOT Defensive Driving course, led by instructor Tony Jobanek. Eighty employees attended the engaging 4 hour training course focused on preparing employees with the following defensive driving techniques.

- Looking ahead and expecting the unexpected.
- Controlling your speed.
- Maintaining a safe following distance.
- Preparedness for the reactions of other drivers.
- Driving safely for weather and/or road conditions.
- Being alert and distraction free.
- Watching and respecting other drivers.

In an effort to provide employees with safe driving skills both at work and in their personal vehicles, employees attend a defensive driving training yearly. The hope is that the skills taught in these courses allow them to defend themselves against possible collisions caused by bad drivers, drunk drivers, and poor weather. The training course reinforced the ever growing issue of distracted driving, which is mainly caused by cell phone usage.

## **Sewer and Water Line Replacement Projects Update**

By the end of next week, H & J Construction will have completed three of the four sewer mainline replacement projects, 1<sup>st</sup> Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, and 7<sup>th</sup> and Adams. They plan on starting the final project on North 9<sup>th</sup> Street the week of October 8<sup>th</sup> pending receiving permits from the Oregon Department of Transportation.

The City's Utility Crew installed a new 8" water mainline between H and I Streets. Next Tuesday and Wednesday they will install the new line from H to G Streets. The following week they will

pressure test and chlorinate the new line. The third week of October the crew will make connections from the mainline to the homes from G to I Streets. Repaying of the street will follow once all the homes are connect to the new line completing the project.

## Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade

This week TAG (The Automation Group) completed installing a new alarm system at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The new system has 25 alarms monitoring critical plant operations. The old system had 3 critical alarms. The new system will help staff insure that the treatment plant is operating properly 24 hours a day.
