Tree Debris Drop Off Site

The City has designated a tree debris drop site at the end of North 12th Street behind the Post Office. City residents and businesses are welcome to bring their tree debris to the site from dawn to dusk. The site will remain open at least through this month and possibly into April. The site is only for tree and shrub debris, no boards, garbage, plastic or roofing is allowed. The City plans on grinding the debris and making it available for gardening and landscaping projects.

City staff is currently working on a limb pickup plan similar to the City's regular limb pick up program. Once the plan is completed we will notify residents of dates and locations of the limb pickup. Please wait until the plan is released and the snow has melted before preparing for the limb pickup.

Estimated vs. Actual Meter Readings

The City's utility workers are working diligently to clear the roads, sidewalks, parks, and other city facilities from debris caused by the recent snow storm. In an effort to remain timely in providing utility bills, it will be necessary to estimate water consumption for the utility bill being mailed to our customers this month. The City will use the utility billing software to create each customer's estimate. The estimates will be based on the consumption during the last meter read period. For example, if the previous period consumption was 1000 gallons, the estimated consumption will be 1000 gallons. The readings will be reviewed by the Utility Billing clerk for reasonableness. However, there could be estimates that are not in line with actual usage and will be addressed during the next billing cycle.

Bridge Repair Project

After a slight delay because of the snow the Bridges Repair Project will be getting underway next week starting on Wednesday, March 14th. The work will begin on the Main Street Bridge with the westbound lane being closed on the 14th through the 18th. The traffic lanes will be open at night and on the weekend. Work is scheduled to then close the eastbound lanes from March 19th -21st during daytime only. There may be short periods of closures of both lanes to allow for construction material deliveries. Work has not been scheduled for the Harrison or Silk Creek Bridges yet. To get up-to-date information about the projects and the impact on traffic visit the City's Construction Corner webpage. February 2019 Building Inspection Services Report

For the month of February the Building Division of the Public Works & Development Department issued 30 permits, 3 for new homes, and performed 101 inspections in Cottage Grove. Staff issued 12 permits and performed 42 inspections for the City of Creswell. In Veneta, 10 permits were issued, and they performed 78 inspections. Staff reviewed and completed 13 plan sets in February and 9 plan sets are in review or on hold for additional information from the applicants.

Wastewater Treatment Plant

On Monday, Wastewater Treatment Plant Staff successfully installed the rebuilt wet well pump that exploded last month. The plant is fully operational without the need of portable pumps to operate. The City would like to thank the cities of Eugene and Woodburn for providing the portable pumps while the treatment plant's pump was being rebuilt. The portable pumps were used during the latest storm event which allowed the plant to process all the sewage during the high flows. Staff would also like to thank Ben Howell coming with his crane to set the pump and Builders Electric for rewiring the pumps.

Cottage Grove Housing Advisory Committee Meeting

On Tuesday, the Cottage Grove Housing Advisory Committee met with Becky Hewitt from ECONorthwest to start discussing strategies from the Housing Needs Analysis. Three strategies were discussed which included partnering on surplus South Lane School District property, Urban Renewal as a housing implementation tool, and property tax abatement programs. The committee also discussed other housing priorities. The committee will meet again in April to further discuss the potential strategies.
