The Cottage Grove Waver, Clarence

On April 17th Clarence Kreamier "The Cottage Grove Waver" passed away at the age of 70. For several years Clarence spent time sitting along East Main Street at the intersection of 16th Street waving to folks as they drove by. He had a large following supporting his effort to brighten everyone's day. Several requests to place a bench at the location where Clarence sat were received by the Mayor and Council members.

The Mayor secured permission from the land owner, Ernie Olson for the City to install a bench in Clarence's memory. The Public Works & Development staff located a new bench and had

Brush Mountain

On Monday Lane Forest Products will start chipping the large mountain of brush on North 12th Street behind DariMart. A pile of chips will be available for residents to take in a self serve u-haul

manner. Lane Forest will be chipping a couple days a week until everything is chipped. To recover costs of the chipping some of the chips will be sold as hog fuel to local mills. We will monitor the local demand and do our best to have enough chips available for local residents to have and use.

Residents are encouraged to have their limbs out the weekend before the pickup dates and asked to follow the guidelines for preparing the limbs for pickup.
