

Pat Patterson Memorial Service

The Memorial Service for John "Pat" Patterson will be held on Sunday, January 12, 2020 at 2:00 pm in the Cottage Grove Armory. Pat was a City Councilor from 1985 to 2009. Prior to serving on the City Council he served on the Planning Commission from 1972 to 1981. He passed away on Thursday, January 2, 2020.



At his last meeting as a City Councilor in December 2008 the Youth Advisory Council Scholarship was renamed the Pat Patterson Youth Advisory Council Scholarship to recognize his support of the youth of the community. He was an outspoken supporter of the creation and continuation of the Cottage Grove Peer Court and of the Cottage Grove Youth Advisory Council.

Our condolences go to his family on his passing. We are so grateful for his many contributions to the community over the years.

State of the City

On Monday, January 13, 2020 Mayor Jeff Gowing will present his State of the City address at the beginning of the City Council meeting. The City Council meeting starts at 7:00 pm in the Cottage Grove City Hall.

Winter Storm Warning

The National Weather Service has issued a Winter storm warning starting today, Friday, January 10th running through Thursday, January 16th. They are predicting heavy snow accumulation for elevations above 2,000 feet through Sunday with snow levels lowering to the valley floor Monday through Thursday. City staff has prepared the snow removal and sanding equipment in anticipation of the potential of snow and are ready to mobilize as needed. Please take time to prepare yourself, family and friends for adverse weather conditions and the potential for power outages and the possibility of being homebound.

Fats, Oils, and Grease Prevention Program

Starting next week the Utility Supervisor and two Maintenance Workers will be visiting businesses that prepare food to discuss with them the Fats, Oils, and Grease Prevention Program.

Food preparation businesses are required to have and maintain grease traps that remove fats, oils, and grease (FOG) before they enter the sanitary sewer lines. Once in the sewer lines the FOG can cause the lines to plug causing sewage backups. FOG is very difficult and expensive to treat when it enters to the sewage treatment plant. Removing FOG before it gets into the sanitary sewer lines will reduce the potential of plugs, extend the life of the lines and reduce the cost to treat sewage. Under Cottage Grove's Municipal Code it is illegal for businesses to release FOG into the sanitary sewer system. The intent of the program is to educate food preparers about FOG and work together in making sure it doesn't get into the sanitary sewer system.

Community Trust Homes

DevNW will be holding a ground breaking celebration on Friday, January 24th from 10:00 to 11:00 am at 910-960 Arthur Avenue for six community land trust homes in Cottage Grove (a mix of two and three bedrooms). This creates six new homes that will remain permanently affordable for our community. Come to the ground breaking and hear more about this unique affordable housing coming to Cottage Grove.

Because of the ground breaking, DevNW now needs to get the word out about these new homes. Are you or someone you know interested in buying a home? If so, the application period will be open January 14th through February 3rd. An application demonstrates interest in purchasing one of the homes, it does not guarantee selection. DevNW will work with applicants to determine eligibility and mortgage readiness.

There will be two information sessions to learn more about this amazing opportunity: January 16th at 6:30 pm (DevNW Springfield office, 212 Main Street, Springfield) or January 28th at 7:00 pm (Cottage Grove Community Center, 700 E. Gibbs Ave, Cottage Grove). All applicants will be entered into a lottery to move forward, attendance at an information session is not required to apply.
