September 2019 Building Inspection Services Report

For the month of September the Building Division of the Public Works & Development Department issued 52 permits and performed 167 inspections in Cottage Grove. In Creswell, 27 permits were issued and 50 inspections were performed. In Veneta, 21 permits were issued, two new homes and performed 51 inspections. Staff reviewed and approved 28 plan sets in September and an additional 12 plan sets are in review or on hold for additional information from the applicants.

Veterans Housing Open House

On Thursday, October 10th from 5:30 to 7:00 pm at the American Legion located at 826 W. Main Street, Homes for Good Housing Agency will be hosting an open house to share information on the four homes for veterans they plan on constructing this next year at the corner of Ash and I Streets. Homes for Good purchased the property from the American Legion and secured a grant from Lane County to help with construction of the new homes. Homes for Good has partnered

with the University of Oregon's OregonBILDS program where students design and assist in constructing the homes. Please come to the open house, learn about the project and share comments on the proposed homes.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

On Tuesday, October 1st, the South Lane School District hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony for the newly remodeled Warren Daugherty Aquatic Center. The ceremony celebrated the completion of a new 25 yard 8 lane competition swim pool, a heated therapy, new lobby and restrooms, and a new heating and cooling system. Mayor Gowing and several City Councilors attended the event. The Mayor shared comments recognizing the great achievement and the importance of the pool to the community.
