Youth Advisory Council

Watershed Council Events

The Coast Fork Willamette Watershed Council has a number of activities that will be happening in the next few weeks.

Tomorrow, Saturday November 16th from 9:00 am to 11:00 am they will be hosting the Fall Bird Walk at the Row River Nature Park. Everyone, regardless of their birding ability, is invited to join the walk that will be led by Grace Fowler-Gore. Participants should meet by the kiosk near the weigh scales. Be sure to dress for the weather, bring water, snacks, binoculars and a bird identification book.

The last Science Pub for 2019 will be held on Tuesday, November 26th from 5:00 to 7:00 pm at the Axe & Fiddle at 657 East Main Street. The presentation by Chris Homanics, will be "Fruit and Nut Explorations of the Pacific Northwest" and will illustrate how the revival of diverse local agroforestry production can provide a resilient source of foods, medicines and materials. Chris is the founder of the Agrarian Sharing Network, board member of the Home Orchard Society, and runs an edible-focused nursery called Head, Hands, Heart.

The committee met to review opportunities for committee members to help continue the work of the Scenic Bikeway program while the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department recruits a new staff coordinator for the program.

Street Lights

With the change of seasons, it is getting darker earlier. The increased hours of darkness provide all of us the opportunity to experience the luminous glow of the over 509 street lights throughout the community. Because of that we also start to notice the street lights that don't light up or the indecisive ones that just can't seem to either stay on or off. It is very difficult to monitor all 509 streetlights every day, so it is important that citizens play an active role in helping to spot the malfunctioning street lights so they can get the help they need quickly.

Most of the street lights in Cottage Grove are owned and maintained by Pacific Power. The remaining street lights are owned by EPUD with a very small group are owned by the City.

Nearly every street light has an identification plate or sticker on the pole. The plate identifies the electric utility that services that light and provides an identification number for that pole. The electric utilities need the identification number to find the street light. If the light is serviced by Pacific Power, citizens can directly report the errant light by visiting the Pacific Power website at: pacificpower.net and go to "Outages and Safety". If the light is serviced by EPUD, citizens can directly report the malfunctioning light by visiting the EPUD website at epud.org and select the "Street Light Repair" under the "My Home" tab. Any light can also be reported to the Public Works Department at (541)942-3349. The Engineering Division will then submit the report to the appropriate electrical utility.

Birds of a Feather Fall Together

Part of the festivities that day will be reliving the 1930's Turkey Drop.
