Martin v. City of Boise

You may have heard the news that the U.S. Supreme Court denied the petition to hear the Martin v. City of Boise case on December 16th. This lets stand the 9th Circuit Court ruling that if a homeless person has no option of sleeping indoors, a city cannot cite him or her for violating an ordinance disallowing sleeping outside in a public space.
