# **November 2019 Building Inspection Services Report**

For the month of November the Building Division of the Public Works & Development Department issued 50 permits and performed 136 inspections in Cottage Grove. In Creswell 12 permits were issued and 38 inspections were performed. In Veneta, 14 permits were issued and 63 inspections were performed. Staff reviewed and approved 22 plan sets in October and an additional 6 plan sets are in review or on hold for additional information.

# **City wide Leaf Pickup Update**

Utility crews continue to remove leaf piles throughout the City and will until all the piles are picked up. Property owners can continue to place leaves in the approved locations until December 15<sup>th</sup>. Crews plan on completing the removal of leaves by December 20<sup>th</sup>.
