# May 2021 Building Inspection Services Report

For the month of May the Building Division of the Public Works & Development Department issued 49 permits, 1 for a new single family home, and performed 168 inspections in Cottage Grove. In Creswell 22 permits were issued, 1 for a single family home, and 47 inspections were performed. In Veneta, 20 permits were issued, and 43 inspections were performed. In Coburg 6 permits were issued, one for a new single family home, and 38 inspections were performed. Staff reviewed and approved 21 plan sets in May and 26 plan sets are in review or on hold for additional information.

### **Neighborhood Meeting**

On Saturday June 5, 2021 at 2:00 pm the Public Works & Development Director, Faye Stewart, will be hosting a neighborhood meeting at Chestnut and G Street. The meeting is being called to discuss the two very large Redwood trees growing in the park street at that location. The trees have outgrown the park strip and have damaged the sidewalk, street, sewer line, storm drain, and the homeowner's basement. Please join Faye to discuss the potential removal of the trees and any thoughts you may have regarding the trees.
