Development Staff attend Low Impact Development (LID) Training

City Engineer Ron Bradsby, Community Development Director Howard Schesser and City Planner Amanda Ferguson attended Local Impact Development implementation training. The training was to learn how to implement the template that has been developed by 16 agencies over the last two years. The goal was to develop a guide that is aimed at western Oregon and the needs and limitations of smaller jurisdictions. Trying to adapt storm water programs from large jurisdictions for smaller jurisdictions has not been successful. The partners have developed a template and guide called: "LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT IN WESTERN OREGON – A *Practical Guide for Watershed Health.*" The guide will assist smaller jurisdictions in developing a storm water program, including erosion and sediment control, in order to meet our obligations under the Clean Water Act. Jurisdictions can use the guide which has a cafeteria style of best management practices to develop their ordinances for storm water requirements. Zone Change Public Hearing Scheduled

The City Council will consider an application from Eric Taylor and Glen Taylor to amend the Zoning Map from C-2 Central Business to C-2P Community Commercial. The public hearing is scheduled for the regular meeting on Monday April 11, 2016 at 7:00 pm in the Council Chambers. The Planning Commission held a public hearing on March 16, 2016. The staff report, public hearing minutes and proposed ordinance will be provided with agenda prior to the public hearing. Any questions should be directed to the Community Development Department.

Transportation System Plan Update County Public Hearing

Lane County Planning Commission considered the Cottage Grove Transportation System Plan Update at their March 15th public hearing. Co-adoption by Lane County is required as the plan includes County land in the Cottage Grove Urban Growth Boundary. Community Development Director Schesser attended the hearing and was the only who spoke on the matter. Commissioners had a few clarification questions and voted to forward a positive recommendation to the Board of Commissioners to approve the plan and co-adopt it.
