It is going to be a great concert season with KNND bringing in Home Free on July 14<sup>th</sup> during Bohemia Days, the Eugene Symphony on July 24<sup>th</sup>, and the Cottage Grove Chamber's Wednesday night Concerts in the Park. While not complete, Bohemia Park has transformed Cottage Grove. The park now hosts a summer concert series and numerous other festivals and events, entertaining both locals and visitors.
