Beeper

Mayor Jeff Gowing will be holding the Mayor's Bike Ride tomorrow. The ride will begin at 10:00 am at Row River Trailhead Park. The riders will proceed to the Mosby Creek Trailhead, have a treat there and then return back to town for a family-friendly 6 mile ride. The more adventurous riders may proceed up the trail beyond the Mosby Creek Trailhead. There have been concerns that the ride would not occur but with the air quality returning to good today, the Mayor invites anyone interested to come out and join him to experience the trail.

Congratulations Erich Schroeder

Erich Schroeder, Wastewater Treatment Acting Superintendent, was elected to serve as a board member for the West Central section of the Pacific Northwest Clean Water Association (PNCWA). The PNCWA is a group that is dedicated to education, dissemination of technical/scientific information, promotion of sound water/wastewater laws, and programs in Washington, Idaho and Oregon.

Wastewater Treatment Plant to host November Meeting

On November 16, 2017, the Pacific Northwest Clean Water Association will be having a regular board meeting along with performing a plant profile of the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant. Approximately thirty to fifty operators will be meeting in Cottage Grove at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Walt Meyers with West Yost Associates and Erich Schroeder from the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant will be discussing the future of Cottage Grove's effluent reuse program and the potential expansion project. It will also include a tour of our facility.

Fire Flow Testing

Thursday afternoon the City performed a fire flow test on the new Taylor Pump Station at various fire hydrants in the Taylor Avenue, Park Street, Red Hill, and Cottage Heights neighborhoods. The results showed the fire flows to be between 1,300 to 1,700 gallons per minute. This exceeds the minimum 500 gallons per minute required by the State. Because of the

volume of the flow, it caused scouring of the water pipe distribution system stirring up the fine mineral particulates existing inside the pipe. This normally cleans up a short time after the test. If water is discolored, the recommendation is to run a faucet until it clears up. If the water is not clearing up, please contact the Public Works & Development Department at (541) 942-3349 and we will work to resolve the issue.
