Eugene Symphony in the Park



Bloodmobile Blood Drive

Participate in the Blood Drive being held in the Cottage Grove Community Center Parking Lot located at 700 E. Gibbs Avenue on Thursday, July 31, and Friday, August 1 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. Appointments are required for the best possible experience, with same-day appointments available at most locations. Remember to bring your photo ID, and for safety, we request no visitors under 16 at the donation sites.

Railroad Track Improvement Project

Central Oregon & Pacific Railroad (CORP) will be installing new rail along sections of the line that run through Lane County. As a result, three railroad crossings in Cottage Grove will be affected by these improvements. Please take note of the following locations and dates when the railroad crossings will be closed.



- S. 6th St / E. Quincy Ave Closing Wednesday, August 6th from 7:00 am 7:00 pm
- Villard Ave Closing Thursday, August 7th from 7:00 am 7:00 pm
- E. Chamberlain Ave Closing Friday, August 8th from 7:00 am 7:00 pm

Dust Abatement

On Wednesday, July 23, City Utility staff worked with a contractor to apply dust abatement to all the gravel City streets. The dust abatement is a natural vegetable pulp that is safe for the environment and vehicles, reducing dust along the streets.

EDA Main Street Revitalization Project

The flower beds and tree wells are prepared for planting, the sidewalks on the south side of Main Street are nearly finished, and the installation of light poles will begin soon.


The south side of the 5th Street intersection has reopened. Please be aware that a stop sign has been placed on Main Street at this location.

Currently, the south side of the 6th Street and Main Street intersection is closed. Wildish crews have removed the street and sidewalks leading to the alley, installed a new fire hydrant, along with irrigation lines and electrical work. The repaying process is set to start on Monday, July 28th, with the installation of curb and gutter. Wildish crews anticipate pouring the sidewalks by the end of that week. The pouring at the 6th Street intersection is scheduled for the week of August 4th.

The 7th Street intersection has reopened, and a four-way stop sign has been placed at this intersection.

Additionally, on Monday, July 28th, crews will close the south side of the 8th Street and Main Street intersection to begin the replacement process. Wildish will start excavation on the north side of Main Street on Wednesday, July 30th. Excavation will commence at the bridge and proceed east towards 5th Street. Traffic will be diverted at the 5th Street intersection to the south side, and traffic will remain westbound only.

Grant Funding for Low to Moderate Income Home Repairs

Cottage Grove has partnered with St. Vincent de Paul's Regional Housing Rehabilitation Program (RHRP) to offer grant funding for low-interest or deferred-payment loans intended for critical home repairs that ensure the health and safety of owner-occupants. Typically, the loans are repaid when the home is sold and have a 3% interest rate and 1.720% APR.
