

EDA Main Street Revitalization Project

Traffic will remain on the south side of Main Street for the entire project length, from Highway 99 to the Main Street Bridge. The 5th and 7th Street intersections are open for crossing and are operating as four-way stops.

NORTH SIDE PROGRESS:

The 8th Street bulb-outs have been formed and poured. Crews will work on the installing the bollards and preparing for the intersection to be poured.

Sidewalk and "sparkle" work is completed between 7th and 8th Street.

6TH TO 7TH STREET INTERSECTION:

The intersection concrete has been poured. Asphalt will be scheduled shortly.

The 6th Street intersection will open as soon as possible.




Sidewalk and "sparkle" work has been completed.

The north side of the street was poured with black concrete on Tuesday, October 14, from the bridge to 6th Street.

UPCOMING WORK:

The remainder of the road is actively being prepared for the black concrete pour.

The next pour, from the 6th Street intersection to the 8th Street intersection, is scheduled, weather permitting, for Monday, October 20.

Annual Leaf Pick Up

Fall is here and City staff will begin the Annual Leaf Pick Up on the morning of Monday, October 27. Please visit Leaf Pickup Program | Cottage Grove Oregon for information and guidelines on where to place your leaf pile or pick up a brochure at City Hall.

It is important that leaves are placed on designated City streets and in approved parking areas <u>no later</u> than Sunday evening, October 26.



This will ensure that City staff does not miss your leaf pile, as they make their way around town. Placing leaves out any later than Sunday may mean that your leaves will not be picked up on Monday and you may have to wait until the next pick-up date.

If property owners do not have street or parking sites that are approved for pick up or you are not able to get your leaves out before Sunday evening, you may use the **drop site at the Row River Water Treatment Plant, located at 3300 Row River Road**.

Additional pick-ups will take place on Monday, November 17 and on Monday, December 1.
