### Yard of the Week

#### The Dry Season has Begun

June ends today and we are in the middle of what is the typical dry season for Cottage Grove. Irrigation of the City's Parks and open spaces is now important to keep those spaces green and inviting. We entered the effluent application time in April and it is in full use now at Middlefield Golf Course and the grass areas of the 174 freeway interchange. The effluent is reclaimed water from the treatment process at the Cottage Grove Water Reclamation Facility (formerly called the Cottage Grove Wastewater Treatment Plant). The resulting water (effluent) from the treatment plant can be discharged into the Coast Fork Willamette River during the winter when river flows are high and temperature is not an issue, but when we have lower flows during the spring through fall, temperature is a major issue. Treating the wastewater to meet the low temperature regulations is very expensive.

In 2006 the City purchased Middlefield Golf Course to secure the use of the entire property for irrigation using the effluent. Temperature is not an issue for land application. Since beginning the effluent application on the course we have applied over 405,872,000 gallons on the course. This has eliminated the need to use the water rights for the golf course property (the old right from the original agricultural use) and has allowed the transfer of the point of diversion of the .62 mgd (million gallons/day) water rights to the Row River Water Treatment Plant for use during the spring through fall season for drinking water.

As the City's population grows we will need more land for irrigation using the effluent. Working with the Oregon Department of Transportation we have received approval to irrigate the grass areas of the 174 interchange. The City is also installing pipe to carry the effluent to Bohemia, Trailhead and Coiner Parks to allow for irrigation of the parks with the effluent rather than treated drinking water.

## **2023 Northwest Clerks Institute**

City Recorder Mindy Roberts attended the Municipal Clerks Certification and Professional Development training June 11<sup>th</sup> to June 16<sup>th</sup> in Tacoma, Washington. There were 64 people in attendance from Oregon, Washington and Alaska to take part in the week long experience. Course topics included Financial Management and Budgeting, Advanced Records Management, Keys to Supervision and Creating Successful Results. The training is the second of a three year process that will allow Mindy to obtain designation as a Certified Municipal Clerk.

A subject suffering from a mental health episode and under the influence of

controlled substances was eventually taken into custody and charged with Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Reckless Endangering and Disorderly Conduct.
