A public meeting of the Budget Committee of the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, State of Oregon, to discuss the budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023 will be held in person in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 400 E. Main Street. The meeting will take place on the 10th day of May 2022 at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting is to receive the budget message and to receive comment from the public on the budget. Main Street, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to Noon and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. or online at <https://www.cottagegroveor.gov/finance/page/budgets>. To review the budget in person, please call the Finance Department to arrange a time for pick-up.
